

INTRODUCTION

7 *Deadly Sins* is co-produced by Expressions Dance Company and QPAC. The 63-minute full length work premiered in the Playhouse Theatre, QPAC (850 seat venue) in Brisbane from 21 - 29 August 2015 for 8 performances closely followed by 2 performances at the Gold Coast Arts Centre.

#1 Intensive Dance Teacher workshop

7 Deadly Sins - School Workshop

This workshop is designed to enhance the experience of students attending a 7 *Deadly Sins* performance. Your students can get up close and personal with the EDC dancers as together they explore the themes, characters and choreography of the work and how this translates into a performance. This workshop is suitable for all students of the Performing Arts and can be tailored towards drama students or dance students.

The workshop can feature a short contemporary dance class led by the EDC dancers including drills and exercises used to develop choreography and characters of the show. Your students can also learn some repertoire from 7 *Deadly Sins* and enjoy a relaxed Q&A session with the dancers. This workshop provides a unique insight into the choreographic processes used to create the production and supports the extensive Teachers Notes supplied.

#3 Dance Workshop for people with special needs
