ABOUT THE SHOW

The Owl and the Pussycat by Edward Lear is an enduring and beloved piece of poetry and nostalgia, first published in 1871 as part of his book *Nonsense Songs, Stories, Botany, and Alphabets*. This irresistible blend of romance and nonsense tells of the love between the two title characters, who sail together for a year and a day to the land "where the Bong-tree grows". They discover a pig with a ring in his nose, buy it for a shilling and are married by a turkey the very next day.

This reimagining of Edward Lear's beloved childhood poem is an enchanting and intimate musical experience. This charming children's work melds live performance, operatic vocals, chamber music, puppetry and experiential theatre inside a giant green boat and immersive landscape. Created specifically for children 4-10 years, this interactive journey inspires, educates and enthralls by inviting children, alongside their families, carers and teachers, to participate in musical and multi-sensory ways to help our lovable couple reach their destination.

Designed for festival locations and adaptable to theatre spaces (black box and proscenium stage), children are invited aboard a giant green pea boat for a 45-minute performance. An intimate setting is created with mixed pea cushions and benches, and a limited capacity of 120 people. Audience members will be integrated into the action with interactive theatrical devices, designed to spark imaginative thought with strong tactile and aural stimulation. The cast consists of 3 singers, soprano, mezzo-soprano and baritone, and a chamber ensemble of cello, clarinet/bass clarinet and vibraphone. The new score will include interactive musical segments, some spoken delivery and will be integrated with Kodaly early childhood education principles.

This national collaboration of female creatives, including Penny Challen (Opera Q Project Puccini), Kathryn Marquet (La Boite, QT, Pale Blue Dot), Bridget Boyle (QT, debase productions), Lisa Cheney (Making Waves, MSO, TSO) and Alicia Cush (Opera Q, Circa) will create a landmark musical work for children exploring the universal themes of love, adventure, harmony and acceptance.

ABOUT THE COMPANY

Little Match Productions is an independent Brisbane-based company that creates contemporary musical performance works that traverse comedy-cabaret, opera, classical music and children's theatre. The company is passionate about exploring our collective humanity via its most primal and intrinsically expressive media - the voice. Over the past six years, Artistic Director Alicia Cush, Creative Producer Bethan Ellsmore & Designer Penny Challen have developed a reputation for their unique ability to present classical vocal techniques in innovative contemporary contexts.

Sarah Murr - Owl

Sarah is a 2015 graduate of the Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University. Following graduation, Sarah joined the Australian and International touring casts of Les Misérables, as first cover for Madame Thénardier. She has also performed as Tracy Turnblad in Hairspray and as Paquette in Candide with Opera Queensland.

Irena Lysiuk - Pussycat

Irena is a classically trained, versatile soprano with over 10 years of performance experience. With a Bachelor of Music in Performance and a Graduate Diploma of Music Studies in opera, Irena has performed the roles of Gretel in Hansel and Gretel and Adina in Fizz!, with Opera Queensland's touring programs.

Jackson McGovern – Moon/Piggy-Wig/Turkey Prophet/Mice/Honey Bear

A graduate of the Queensland Conservatorium's Bachelor of Musical Theatre program, Jackson has already begun to make his mark on the professional scene. Stage credits include Josh in Wax Lyrical's production of Nineteen, Hunter in [Title of Show] for Understudy Productions, and Mark Cohen in Rent at Melt Festival.

ALICIA CUSH – Creative Producer/Musical Director

Alicia is a Brisbane-based performer, musical director, arranger and independent producer. Currently, Alicia is a touring vocalist/instrumentalist with Circa Contemporary Circus and the Creative Director of Little Match Productions, directing and performing with cabaret collective Babushka and operatic ensemble Belladiva.

PENNY CHALLEN - Designer/Producer

Penny is an internationally accomplished designer, having trained at QCA (Fine Art) and NIDA (Design), before working mostly in the UK from 2002. Since returning to Australia, she has designed *La Boheme* for Opera Q, *Happy Days* for Queensland Theatre, *The Glass Menagerie* and *Water Wars* for La Boite and *Motherland* for Ellen Belloo.

DR BRIDGET BOYLE - Director

Bridget is a Brisbane-based performer, writer, director, researcher and teacher in Drama. In 1998, she co-founded Debase Productions and their theatrical works have been performed in venues across Australia and internationally, including Brisbane Festival, Queensland Theatre and Out of the Box Festival.

KATHRYN MARQUET – Writer/Librettist

Kathryn is a Brisbane-based playwright and actor. She is a graduate of the acting program at the University of Southern Queensland and holds an Advanced Postgraduate Diploma in Writing and Editing from the University of Queensland. She is currently completing a Master of Philosophy at UQ in playwriting and tutors regularly in playwriting and performance.

LISA CHENEY - Composer

Lisa is an Australian composer of acoustic and acousmatic music. Her music communicates through varied styles, exploring notions of connection and authenticity through fascinations with expression, poeticism, fragility, delicacy and atmospheric soundscapes. In addition to her role as co-founder of 'Making Waves', she is currently completing her PhD in Music at The University of Melbourne.

AUDIENCE ENGAGEMENT

OVERVIEW

Community engagement opportunities associated with this touring work will involve two different workshops, directed at members of our target audience/demographic.

Objectives – Create a stronger relationship with the themes of the work, acceptance, tolerance and harmony. All workshop facilitators are tertiary-trained to a Masters level and have the following areas of expertise: Alicia Cush: Kodaly early music education, Ensemble singing

WORKSHOP #1 Hoot and Meow in Harmony

Come explore the magical bong-tree forest and meet the colourful characters of The Owl and the Pussycat. This early childhood workshop is for children aged 4-8 and involves experiencing music through movement, games, singing, rhymes and stories. Using ageappropriate activities based on the Kodaly and Orff teaching methods, children will play percussion instruments and explore the show's themes of harmony, adventure and acceptance in a fun and multi-sensory approach. Climb



aboard the pea green boat for a joyful introduction to classical music that will have everyone singing the Sea Bear honey song and rapping with Sir Kitty Cat!

Exploring the show's themes of adventure, harmony and acceptance, climb aboard for a fun introduction to origami with additional creative activities suitable for older children. an Owl and a Pussycat with their colourful new friends.






